Holy Trinity Community Food Pantry

Trinity Pantry started out as a small help service for those who had simply didn't have enough to eat or who had met with some temporary crisis and no funds. Over thirty years later, it is now a food assistance service providing for over 1000 people each year.

The pantry is entirely staffed by volunteers, and with only small amounts of state government funding, it depends predominantly on donations and contributions of food to help others.

PSALM 29 The Voice of God in a Great Storm

1 Ascribe to the Lord, O heavenly beings,
ascribe to the Lord glory and strength.

**2 Ascribe to the Lord the glory of his name;
worship the Lord in holy splendour.**

3 The voice of the Lord is over the waters;
the God of glory thunders,
the Lord, over mighty waters.

**4 The voice of the Lord is powerful;
the voice of the Lord is full of majesty.**

5 The voice of the Lord breaks the cedars;
the Lord breaks the cedars of Lebanon.

**6 He makes Lebanon skip like a calf
and Sirion like a young wild ox.**

7 The voice of the Lord flashes forth flames of fire.

**8 The voice of the Lord shakes the wilderness;
the Lord shakes the wilderness of Kadesh.**

9 The voice of the Lord causes the oaks to whirl
and strips the forest bare,
and in his temple all say, "Glory!"

**10 The Lord sits enthroned over the flood;
the Lord sits enthroned as king forever.**



SECOND READING 1 Corinthians 1.21-31

21 For since, in the wisdom of God, the world did not know God through wisdom, God decided, through the foolishness of the proclamation, to save those who believe. 22 For Jews ask for signs and Greeks desire wisdom, 23 but we proclaim Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to gentiles, 24 but to those who are the called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. 25 For God's foolishness is wiser than human wisdom, and God's weakness is stronger than human strength.

26 Consider your own call, brothers and sisters: not many of you were wise by human standards, not many were powerful, not many were of noble birth. 27 But God chose what is foolish in the world to shame the wise; God chose what is weak in the world to shame the strong; 28 God chose what is low and despised in the world, things that are not, to abolish things that are, 29 so that no one might boast in the presence of God. 30 In contrast, God is why you are in Christ Jesus, who became for us wisdom from God, and righteousness and sanctification and redemption, 31 in order that, as it is written, "Let the one who boasts, boast in the Lord."
